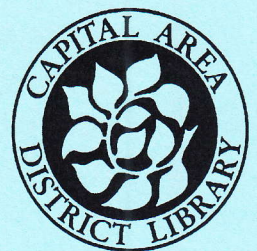
Historic Michigan Cookery with Priscilla Massie

3:00 - 4:00 pm

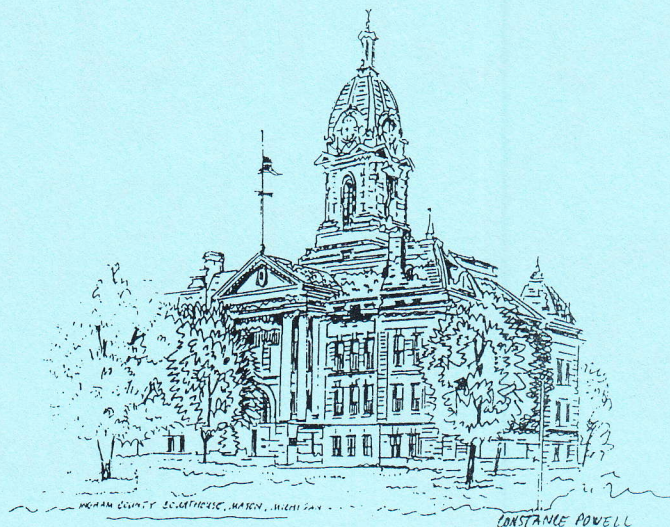
Michigan History Storytelling with Larry B. Massie
