

CIRCUS GROUNDS TO BE BUILT UP

McPHERSON LOTS TO BE PUT ON THE MARKET

ENTIRE "FORTY" WILL BE SOLD

Western Part of the City Building so Rapidly That All Vacant Land is in Demand

Lansing's remarkable growth and the great demand for building lots have so appealed to the owners of the McPherson property in the western part of the city that, that fine tract of land will be platted and placed on the market in the near future. The property is known as the "Forty Acres" and is bounded by Logan street on the east, Shiawassee on the south and Saginaw on the north. There has been a great demand for building sites in that vicinity and the property is surrounded by many homes that have been erected within a few years.

Messrs. E.G., M.J., and W.J. McPherson, jr., of Howell, owners of the property are in the city today making arrangements for the opening of the tract. It is planned to lay out and grade several streets and water and sewer systems will be put in. The advisability of building artificial walks on all streets is being considered.

The platting of this property will also mean the opening of Genesee street, which at present ends at Logan street.

The McPhersons are owners of a plat on Michigan avenue east that will soon be placed on the market.

The land to be put on sale constitutes the circus grounds used for many years.
